But his Physical Condition is such and his being severely afflicted with Disease of his Lungs and the Atmosphere there being of such a character as to render it impossible to remain there and under the advice of his Physicians there he is compelled to ask to be admitted to some other Soldiers Home. He therefore asks for admission to the Soldiers Home at Quincy Illinois as he believes ~~it is~~ ^{his opinion} that the Climate at Quincy Illinois would be more conducive to his Health and Comfort

and affiant further swears that he is not interested in the prosecution of the claim, and his Postoffice address is Morris County of Grundy, and State of Illinois
