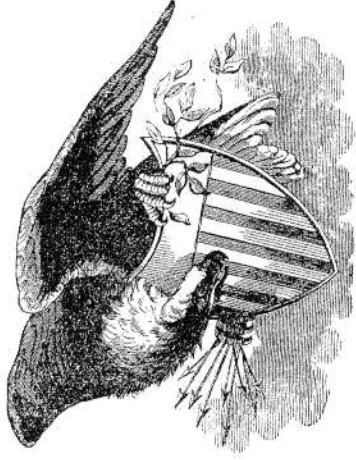


Certificate of Honorable Service.



To all Whom it May Concern:

Know ye, That whereas *James H. Massey* of *Northland* in the county of *Douglas* and *State* of *Dakota*, has applied for a

—† Certificate of Honorable Service †—

This is to Certify, That the aforesaid *James H. Massey* enrolled on the 9th day of *August* 1865, one thousand eight hundred & sixty-five, as a *Corporal* in Company "E", 25th Regiment of *Wisconsin* Volunteers, to serve 3 years, and was honorably discharged on the 7th day of *June* 1865 at *Washington D.C.*, while holding the grade of *Corporal*, and serving honorably in the military service of the United States.

This Certificate is given in case of discharged soldiers upon evidence that the original discharge has been lost or destroyed without the privacy or procurement of the person entitled thereto, and in all cases upon the condition imposed by the Act of Congress approved March 3, 1873, that it "shall not be accepted as a voucher for the payment of any claim against the United States for pay, bounty, or other allowance, or as evidence in any other case."
